THE PAKISTAN FLOOD DISASTER

You will be aware of the devastating floods in Pakistan. More than 14 million people have been affected by the flooding which the Methodist Relief and Development Fund describes as ‘the worst flooding Pakistan has experienced in over 70 years, and it has affected a region already dealing with poverty and conflict’.

The Methodist Relief and Development Fund is seeking to help with the rescue mission.

- Their **immediate** priorities are getting people to places of safety and trying to prevent the outbreak of waterborne diseases.
- In the **long term**, the major challenges will be to restore the communities and livelihoods swept away by the floods.

There is a retiring collection today for donations to the relief fund. If you are a tax payer every £1 you give can be increased to £1.28 at no extra cost to you by using the Gift Aid envelopes available in the pews.
